

VENICE WAYBACK MACHINE

OUR TIME MACHINE WENT SEARCHING FOR INTERESTING RECENT EVENTS

THE PARK VIEW HOTEL OPENED ON FEBRUARY 11, 1927



In June of 1926 the BLE opened its first building, the Hotel Venice. To handle the anticipated volume of real estate investors the BLE quickly started constructing the Park View, which was based on the same blueprints as the Hotel Venice.

During the Depression Dr. Fred Albee converted the vacant hotel into the Florida Medical Center, which provided needed jobs and commerce for Venice. During WW2 the hospital served the Army Air Corp Base. After the war the Park View resumed being a hotel under a succession of different names.



In 1965 a dubious decision was made to raze the historic Park View Hotel to build the Venice Post Office, a bland institutional building that poorly fits the Mediterranean character of our downtown historic district.

With the creation of the Architectural Review Board in 1987, such a mismatch would (hopefully) be disallowed today.

A1926 BLE billboard advertised a Venice real estate sales office in the Park View Hotel.

Notice the Venice Company logo in the center





It is not a coincidence that the current Venice Centennial Logo is similar to the billboard logo seen above, also to the versions on the right. This modern logo was modeled after the historic examples.





WAYBACK MACHINE
LET'S TAKE ANOTHER TRIP



FRED & LOUELLA ALBEE ARRIVE IN VENICE AREA

FEBRUARY 22, 1917

On this date Fred and Luella Albee arrived in Sarasota on a snowbird vacation. It took two days to get there on the Seaboard Airlines Railroad "Homesteader's Special" from New York. The fare was \$25 round trip each but likely the Albee's paid extra for a Pullman Car.

Dr. Albee loved Florida immediately. By the time he left, *only eight days later*, the Doctor had purchased a large parcel of land from the Palmer holdings, then largely owned by Bertha Palmer's sons Honore and Potter. That parcel included all of Nokomis, which includes the area we now know as Bay Point, along with the land that the historic portion of Venice is now located. In short order he hired John Nolen as city planner. Less than one year later Dr. Albee sold the Venice Project to the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers.



In **February** 1925 the Albee's decided to take a break from the New York winter and established Nokomis as their permanent residence. This started the chain of events leading to modern day Venice.
